

ORDER OF THE HARBORMASTER
GULFPORT MUNICIPAL MARINA

**MANDATORY EVACUATION
ORDER**


In accord with City of Gulfport Ordinance 2-218, as it appears that a tropical system (Tropical Storm/Hurricane Sally) will raise the water level in the Marina by at least four feet, and/or based on other advice from the Harrison County Civil Defense, the Harbormaster hereby orders all Marina Tenants to seek safer dockage for their vessels. **All vessels must be removed from the Marina no later than 3:00 PM on September 13, 2020 (i.e., the “evacuation deadline”).** The undersigned will advise as to when this Order is terminated and when vessels may return to the Marina and under what conditions the vessels may return.


You are reminded that if a Marina Tenant fails to abide by this MANDATORY EVAUCATION ORDER, the Tenant will assume any and all liability and responsibility for said vessel and any damage it receives or any damage it may cause to city property as a result of the storm’s impact on the Marina.

You are further reminded that failure to abide by this MANDATORY EVACUATION ORDER may result in a Marina Tenant being denied any further dockage privileges in the Marina.

You are further advised and reminded that failure to abide by this MANDATORY EVAUCATION ORDER shall constitute a misdemeanor and subject a Marina Tenant to the penalties set forth in Section 1-9 of the Code of Ordinances (fines up to \$1000). Each calendar day or part thereof that a vessel remains at the Marina after the evacuation deadline established in the evacuation Order and before the evacuation Order is terminated shall constitute a separate offense.
