EMERGENCY SUPPLEMENTAL ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 2

On March 14, 2020, the Municipal Court Judges issued an "Emergency Administrative Order" in response to the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States and the State of Mississippi. As set out therein, the Mississippi Supreme Court issued an "Emergency Administrative Order" on March 13, 2020, and which has application to proceedings in the Gulfport Municipal Court. This Order states that while courts "will remain open for business to ensure courts fulfill their constitutional and statutory duties" and "should continue normal business matters as much as possible," local judges are best suited to exercising discretionary authority concerning the administration of their dockets, including the scheduling of matters pending before them. As the City of Gulfport and State of Mississippi both continue to be under states of emergency in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, and in view of the existing Proclamations and Executive Orders issued by the Mayor of Gulfport and Governor of the State of Mississippi, the duration of the above March 14, 2020, "Emergency Administrative Order," as extended by "Emergency Supplemental Administrative Order No. 1" issued on March 26, 2020, is in need of additional extension in view of current and continuing circumstances. It is therefore,

ORDERED that the "Emergency Administrative Order" issued by this Court on March 14, 2020, and extended by "Emergency Supplemental Administrative Order No. 1" issued on March 26, 2020, shall now, and hereby is to, remain in effect through 5:00 p.m. on Friday, May 1, 2020.
